



Dear New Patient,

Welcome to our Acupuncture clinic! We know that you have a choice in healthcare providers and we are honored that you've chosen us for your natural health and wellness journey.

Our approach to care is comprehensive and emphasizes treatment of the whole person. Our immediate focus will be to address those issues which are most pressing to you, but we will also make recommendations on how to maximize your overall health and quality of life.

Your 1st visit:

Your first appointment will take approximately 1½ hours and consists of a conversation with your Acupuncturist to compile an extensive medical history. The questions asked in a Traditional Chinese Medicine intake may be completely different from what you've previously experienced in a traditional doctor's office. In addition to asking you about your health, we will use a combination of diagnostic techniques. These techniques may include tongue and pulse diagnosis (traditional Chinese Medicine diagnostics), as well as assessments of pain levels, joint mobility, and range of motion. If appropriate, we may also do an orthopedic or neurological examination.

How many visits will it take?

Follow-up appointments normally take 45min. Since every person is unique in his or her own condition, the number of treatments will vary. The nature, severity and history of how long you've had a problem are all factors that are involved in how many treatments will be necessary. A general rule of thumb is 1 –4 treatments to see changes in your chief complaint, 4 -5 treatments to see significant changes. Additional treatments, though less frequent, may be necessary to strengthen your body's response to crisis and to improve your natural healing power. My biggest joy comes when you no longer need regular treatments!

Preparing for your Acupuncture Treatments

A few tips for making your first and follow-up acupuncture treatments as comfortable and relaxing as possible:

- Be on time for your appointment so you can relax and enjoy! You're welcome to arrive early to sit and relax in our waiting room.
- Wear loose fitting clothes that can easily roll up above your elbows and knees. Also, you may need to expose your abdomen from your rib cage to the top of your hips, so avoid one piece suits or dresses.
- Be sure you have eaten at least a light meal within a few hours prior to arriving. Being over-hungry increases the risk of nausea or dizziness. Avoid overeating immediately before treatment.
- Drink plenty of water and stay hydrated after your appointment.
- For best results, avoid strenuous activity immediately following a treatment. Set aside enough time so that you are not rushing to and from your visit. Physical strain immediately before or after acupuncture can weaken your body.
- During the intake, you will be asked many questions, some related specifically to your complaint and others seemingly unrelated. Oriental Medicine requires the entire person be taken into consideration so we can determine what is causing the condition or disease. We treat the whole person, not just the symptom.

Payment

Payment is due at time of service by cash, personal check, or credit card.

Insurance

We accept most insurance upon approval. Insurance claims will be billed at our Usual and Customary Rates and differ for those who pay in full at the time services are rendered. Please speak with a Front Desk Staff Member who can help verify your Insurance Benefits.



Cancellation Policy

(Missed, Forgotten, No-Show, and Late arrivals)

For your convenience, San Pedro Acupuncture Health Center schedules by appointment only. Walk-in appointments are not generally available at our practice; however we attempt to accommodate acute injuries/conditions as quickly as possible. Should you be unable to keep a scheduled appointment, we would like 48 hour notice but we require 24 hours notice for cancellations. Failure to cancel 24 hours prior to your scheduled appointment will result in a Missed Appointment Fee, equal to half the appointment cost, placed on your account. No-show and forgotten appointments are considered cancellations.

Also, if you are more than 15 minutes late to your appointment, your appointment may be shortened or rescheduled to a different day. Missed appointments prevent us from seeing patients with acute conditions.

Military Discount

In appreciation and acknowledgement of Military Members and their families, San Pedro Acupuncture Health Center offers 10% off follow-up acupuncture treatments. These discounts can only be applied to accounts when payment in full is received at the time of service and discounts cannot be combined.

Information about Acupuncture Treatment

What is Acupuncture? Acupuncture is a practice that involves the stimulation of specific points on the body. It has the effect of normalizing physiological function, modifying the perception of pain, and treating certain diseases or dysfunctions of the body. The stimulation may be produced by needles, heat, digital pressure, electrical currents, or other means, but most frequently by needling.

Herbs and nutritional supplements may be recommended and are considered safe in the practice of Chinese Medicine.

What are the side effects or complications? Acupuncture is considered a safe method of treatment, but occasionally there may be some bruising or tingling near the needling sites that last a few days. There have been extremely rare instances reported in which a patient fainted, developed a scar or infection, experienced a spontaneous miscarriage, or sustained a pneumothorax (air in the chest cavity that can cause a collapsed lung).

What are the contraindications for Acupuncture or use of Chinese Herbal Medicine? Contraindications for acupuncture treatment and certain herbs include a history of a bleeding disorder or current anticoagulant therapy, an implanted pacemaker or prosthetic heart valve, use of certain medications, and/or pregnancy.

ACUPUNCTURE INFORMED CONSENT TO TREAT

I hereby request and consent to the performance of acupuncture treatments and other procedures within the scope of the practice of acupuncture on me (or on the patient named below, for whom I am legally responsible) by the acupuncturist indicated below and/or other licensed acupuncturists who now or in the future treat me while employed by, working or associated with or serving as back-up for the acupuncturist named below, including those working at the clinic or office listed below or any other office or clinic, whether signatories to this form or not.

I understand that methods of treatment may include, but are not limited to, acupuncture, moxibustion, cupping, electrical stimulation, Tui-Na (Chinese massage), Chinese herbal medicine, heat therapy, and nutritional counseling. I understand that the herbs may need to be prepared and the teas consumed according to the instructions provided orally and in writing. The herbs may have an unpleasant smell or taste. I will immediately notify a member of the clinical staff of any unanticipated or unpleasant effects associated with the consumption of the herbs.

I have been informed that acupuncture is a generally safe method of treatment, but that it may have some side effects, including bruising, numbness or tingling near the needling sites that may last a few days, and dizziness or fainting. Burns and/or scarring are a potential risk of moxibustion and cupping, or when treatment involves the use of heat lamps. Bruising is a common side effect of cupping. Unusual risks of acupuncture include spontaneous miscarriage, nerve damage and organ puncture, including lung puncture (pneumothorax). Infection is another possible risk, although the clinic uses sterile disposable needles and maintains a clean and safe environment.

I understand that while this document describes the major risks of treatment, other side effects and risks may occur. The herbs and nutritional supplements (which are from plant, animal and mineral sources) that have been recommended are traditionally considered safe in the practice of Chinese Medicine, although some may be toxic in large doses. I understand that some herbs may be inappropriate during pregnancy. Some possible side effects of taking herbs are nausea, gas, stomachache, vomiting, headache, diarrhea, rashes, hives, and tingling of the tongue. **I will notify a clinical staff member who is caring for me if I am or become pregnant.**

While I do not expect the clinical staff to be able to anticipate and explain all possible risks and complications of treatment, I wish to rely on the clinical staff to exercise judgment during the course of treatment which the clinical staff thinks at the time, based upon the facts then known, is in my best interest. I understand that results are not guaranteed.

I understand the clinical and administrative staff may review my patient records and lab reports, but all my records will be kept confidential and will not be released without my written consent.

By voluntarily signing below, I show that I have read, or have had read to me, the above consent to treatment, have been told about the risks and benefits of acupuncture and other procedures, and have had an opportunity to ask questions. I intend this consent form to cover the entire course of treatment for my present condition and for any future condition(s) for which I seek treatment.

ARBITRATION AGREEMENT

Article 1: Agreement to Arbitrate: It is understood that any dispute as to medical malpractice, that is as to whether any medical services rendered under this contract were unnecessary or unauthorized or were improperly, negligently or incompetently rendered, will be determined by submission to arbitration as provided by California and federal law, and not by a lawsuit or resort to court process except as state and federal law provides for judicial review of arbitration proceedings. Both parties to this contract, by entering into it, are giving up their constitutional right to have any such dispute decided in a court of law before a jury, and instead are accepting the use of arbitration. Further, the parties will not have the right to participate as a member of any class of claimants, and there shall be no authority for any dispute to be decided on a class action basis. An arbitration can only decide a dispute between the parties and may not consolidate or join the claims of other persons who have similar claims.

Article 2: All Claims Must be Arbitrated: It is also understood that any dispute that does not relate to medical malpractice, including disputes as to whether or not a dispute is subject to arbitration, as to whether this agreement is unconscionable, and any procedural disputes, will also be determined by submission to binding arbitration. It is the intention of the parties that this agreement bind all parties as to all claims, including claims arising out of or relating to treatment or services provided by the health care provider including any heirs or past, present or future spouse(s) of the patient in relation to all claims, including loss of consortium. This agreement is also intended to bind any children of the patient whether born or unborn at the time of the occurrence giving rise to any claim. This agreement is intended to bind the patient and the health care provider and/or other licensed health care providers, preceptors, or interns who now or in the future treat the patient while employed by, working or associated with or serving as a back-up for the health care provider, including those working at the health care provider's clinic or office or any other clinic or office whether signatories to this form or not. All claims for monetary damages exceeding the jurisdictional limit of the small claims court against the health care provider, and/or the healthcare provider's associates, association, corporation, partnership, employees, agents and estate, must be arbitrated including, without limitation, claims for loss of consortium, wrongful death, emotional distress, injunctive relief, or punitive damages. This agreement is intended to create an open book account unless and until revoked.

Article 3: Procedures and Applicable Law: A demand for arbitration must be communicated in writing to all parties. Each party shall select an arbitrator (party arbitrator) within thirty days, and a third arbitrator (neutral arbitrator) shall be selected by the arbitrators appointed by the parties within thirty days thereafter. The neutral arbitrator shall then be the sole arbitrator and shall decide the arbitration. Each party to the arbitration shall pay such party's pro rata share of the expenses and fees of the neutral arbitrator, together with other expenses of the arbitration incurred or approved by the neutral arbitrator, not including counsel fees, witness fees, or other expenses incurred by a party for such party's own benefit. Either party shall have the absolute right to bifurcate the issues of liability and damage upon written request to the neutral arbitrator.

The parties consent to the intervention and joinder in this arbitration of any person or entity that would otherwise be a proper additional party in a court action, and upon such intervention and joinder, any existing court action against such additional person or entity shall be stayed pending arbitration. The parties agree that provisions of the California Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act shall apply to disputes within this arbitration agreement, including, but not limited to, sections establishing the right to introduce evidence of any amount payable as a benefit to the patient as allowed by law (Civil Code 3333.1), the limitation on recovery for non-economic losses (Civil Code 3333.2), and the right to have a judgment for future damages conformed to periodic payments (CCP 667.7). The parties further agree that the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association shall govern any arbitration conducted pursuant to this Arbitration Agreement.

Article 4: General Provision: All claims based upon the same incident, transaction, or related circumstances shall be arbitrated in one proceeding. A claim shall be waived and forever barred if (1) on the date notice thereof is received, the claim, if asserted in a civil action, would be barred by the applicable legal statute of limitations, or (2) the claimant fails to pursue the arbitration claim in accordance with the procedures prescribed herein with reasonable diligence.

Article 5: Revocation: This agreement may be revoked by written notice delivered to the health care provider within 30 days of signature and, if not revoked, will govern all professional services received by the patient and all other disputes between the parties.

Article 6: Retroactive Effect: If patient intends this agreement to cover services rendered before the date it is signed (for example, emergency treatment), patient should initial here. _____. Effective as of the date of first professional services.

If any provision of this Arbitration Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and shall not be affected by the invalidity of any other provision. I understand that I have the right to receive a copy of this Arbitration Agreement. By my signature below, I acknowledge that I have received a copy.

NOTICE: BY SIGNING THIS CONTRACT YOU ARE AGREEING TO HAVE ANY ISSUE OF MEDICAL MALPRACTICE DECIDED BY NEUTRAL ARBITRATION AND YOU ARE GIVING UP YOUR RIGHT TO A JURY OR COURT TRIAL. SEE ARTICLE 1 OF THIS CONTRACT.

Payment Responsibility and Authorization

Welcome to the San Pedro Acupuncture Health Center. We are committed to providing you with the best possible care, and we are pleased to discuss our professional fees with you at anytime. Your clear understanding of our financial policy is important to our professional relationship. Please feel free to ask if you have any questions about our fees, financial policy or your responsibility in this matter.

1. All patients must complete our 'Patient Information' form before seeing the Acupuncturist. It is the patients' responsibility to inform us of any changes in this information, including: address, telephone number, employment, insurance coverage, etc.
2. Payment is collected at the time services are rendered.
3. We accept cash, checks and credit cards as methods of payment.
4. Balances older than 30 days will be subject to additional collection fees and charges at a rate of \$25.00 per month until the balance is paid in full, unless other arrangements have been made beforehand and upheld.
5. Returned checks will be charged a \$25.00 service charge.
6. A fee, equal to the amount of 50% of our full fee, will be charged for any missed appointments or appointments cancelled with less than 24 hours notice.
7. **Unaccompanied Minors:** Parents or guardians are responsible for full payment.

I agree to pay in full for services at the time services are rendered.

I understand and agree that there will be a late fee added to my account if I fail to pay within thirty (30) day. The late fee charge will be \$25.00 per month. I understand that I am solely responsible for this late fee.

In the event that I fail to pay the balance of my account to Jennifer Randolph Acupuncture/San Pedro Acupuncture Health Center within sixty(60)days of the date of service, my account will be turned to collection. In the event that it is necessary to turn my account over to collection I will also be responsible for any and all costs of collection, including attorney fees and interest charges.

It is our intention and hope that this written policy will eliminate any future misunderstandings between our office and our patients.

I understand that I am responsible for all fees incurred for services rendered and that full payment is expected at the time these services are rendered, unless advance arrangements are made with our clinic director before services are rendered in office.
